BUILDING PROJECTS

We are very excited to begin the next phase of our building upgrades. The Board of Trustees, Project Manager, Principal and some staff have spent months planning the building changes to meet Ministry requirement for Modern Learning Environments. More importantly to make changes that support the collaborative teaching and learning practice we believe in. The building process will take at least a term and will mean that part of Poutama and Pounamu Atawhai will be out of their space whilst it is upgraded.

Pounamu Atawhai will relocate and set up their learning environment in the hall.

Poutama will use the remaining available space in Poutama along with Ara Toi.

We can assure you that teaching and learning will continue as usual during this time.

Buildings enhance our capacity to work together they do not define it.

TUKUTUKU PANELS

Tukutuku panels are now in place. They are our Te Puawai head and body band design.

These are a classic representation of chevrons, triangles and diamante's, which allude to the ideas of lofty mountains (triangles), protection (chevrons), readiness and excellence (diamonds).

The diamond pattern in particular is important and it connects to an old whakatauki (proverb) "E kore te patiki e hoki ki tana puehu". This proverb is about taking advantage of opportunities when they arise.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES

As much as we all love our assemblies and the sharing of work, we will not be able to do this as a whole school next term.

Our hall will be the space for Pounamu Atawhai to set up and work from.

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







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
