

# SCHOOL ATHLETICS DAY

School Athletics will be held at the Massey University Athletics Track on Wednesday, 1 November. The community is most welcome and encouraged to attend to support students throughout the day.

All students will need to come to school dressed in house colours on the day of Athletics, so if you aren't sure which house your child is in, please ask your child's whanau teacher or contact the school office.

Students will travel to and from the venue via bus. Students will sit in their house teams under marquees at the track. Students will be competing in the 6 different athletic rotations between 10 am and 1.15 pm. We are very fortunate to have Awatapu College help us with rotations and set up again this year.

There will be a morning tea/sunscreen break for our long-distance race for all students who wish to participate (400/800m) halfway through the events. House relays will begin at the end of all events to finish the day for those who are representing their house.

# **BIKE SAFETY PROGRAMME**

Over the first three weeks of this term, our Year 5 and 6 tamariki have the opportunity to be involved in a road safety programme that is centred on practical cycling activities. This programme is delivered by Sport Manawatū. Our tamariki will be taught how to fit a cycle helmet and check a bike to see that it meets legal requirements. They will be taught cycle skills that promote confidence and safe bike handling. Our year sixes have a road skills session on the quiet roads around our school, to practise and implement the skills they have learnt.











# **EPRO 8 WARM UPS**

This term we had an internal event to find out our Epro 8 teams of the future. Mr Bron and Mr Carter organised getting six extra sets of Epro8 equipment and running a two-hour-long event in the hall. A large group of Year 4 and 5 Kids were put into eight teams and were challenged to engineer and problem-solve using maths, teamwork, and building skills. ### FIREWISE PROGRAMME

They talked to us about some of the really important things we need to know when we are around a fire and showed us videos, photos and smoke alarms to help us learn what to do if we have a fire in our home. Mr Pike even got to put on a firefighter's uniform! Junior School children will continue to work through this programme in our classrooms over the next few weeks, and your child will bring home a 'Firewise' booklet to discuss some of their learning with you.

Each team was assigned a country and we represented New Zealand, Argentina and Namibia. # **LEVEL 5 BADGES**

Right from the beginning of a child's time at Riverdale School, they earn 'pins' to work towards earning their Independence License. The Licence system is based on our School Beliefs - Ngā Mātāpono. Over the year, children earn pins for displaying behaviours linked to the indicators of Ngā Mātāpono.

Our Year Sixes who gain over 40 pins are invited to apply to be a Level 5. Invited children must prepare a presentation and present it to their teachers, classmates AND Mr Bron. If Mr Bron thinks the applicant fulfils the criteria for being a Level 5, the student is rewarded with a Level 5 Independence Licence badge.

Only a few of these prestigious badges are awarded each year. So far we have three deserving recipients: Ava Whitta, Madison Oppatt and Kalais Whatuira. We commend them on their excellent attitude towards everything they do, their participation in activities across the school and for being a role model for others to aspire to.







# RIPPA RUGBY IN-HOUSE COMPETITION
