TE AO MAORI

Kia Ora e te whānau,

We would just like to share some of our latest instalments around the kura. We have planted our harakeke in our Pā Harakeke, this is the gated off section behind Poutama. This is still a work in progress but we would like to draw your attention to the area and the Tikanga that goes behind it. This is not an area for tamariki to be running through and playing in. When our plants have matured, it will be open for whānau to use for their own weaving if they would like to. The gates need to stay closed as it is a sacred space, especially as our harakeke are establishing themselves. Thank you to Mrs McIntyre and her trusty helpers for planting our young harakeke.





We have also planted our Pohutakawa tree at the back of Poutama. This tree is a remembrance tree, and relates to the Pohutakawa Star in the Matariki cluster. Last year during our Matariki celebrations our whānau wrote messages on pieces of paper dedicated to their lost ones. We planted those messages with our tree to deepen our connection with our ancestors. Please have a look when you are in school next.

POUTAMA INQUIRY

Poutama's ākonga have been diving deep into our Ecology of Learning Inquiry. We have pulled apart the new Mātāpono values, dissected the characteristics of Te Whiringa Wha AND explored the Treaty of Waitangi and Te Tiriti o Waitangi. We had the pleasure of Angelique Reweti who came to korero with us about Te Titiriti o Waitangi. It was an amazing session and we learnt a lot of new facts. Angelique is not only one of our amazing Māmās but she is a Senior Lecturer at Massey University. She took us through 'Toia Mai' a much loved waiata in our Kura and explicitly pointed out how it relates to the Treaty of Waitangi.

Our ākonga then had an interactive lesson about the balance of power between the tangata whenua and the settlers. We use a tug-of-war rope to explain when there were more tangata whenua in Aotearoa the power was with them. Once more settlers came, then the power changed sides as their numbers grew. It was a fantastic way to help visualise how it could have been back then. We are very thankful for the taonga she shared with us. Ngā mihi nui, Whaea!

School Donation

Dear Parents / Whanau

The Government offers an additional \$150.00 per student in the basic operational grant for all Decile 1-7 schools. Riverdale is ineligible to uplift this amount so we must ask our community for the annual \$150.00 per student school donation to remain.

Your school donations assist in funding additional Learning Support Assistants. The employment of 'support staff' benefits all children. Sometimes directly when they are working with individuals and small groups, or indirectly where they help to free up teachers to take that extra bit of time in an opportune moment to workshop a child through a difficult next step.

School donations also go directly to cover travel costs by bus to whole school events and elite events, these costs have increased significantly. Over the past two years the amount of Government funding to low equity schools has increased ie. The same size school with a low equity index number receives \$200k more than Riverdale School in support funding per year.

As the year progresses we would encourage you all to support us through the school donation.

Donation structure: \$150 per year for 1 child, \$300 for 2+ children or \$40 per term for children starting during the year.

Please remember that there are a range of options to make your donations - ongoing payments, term by term or lump sum.

This year the donation will show on the Hero App under 'Finances'
